

MORRISON COOKIE POLICY

This Cookie Policy explains when and why we use cookies on websites operated by H.R.L. Morrison & Co Group LP and its related entities (Morrison, we, us).

Our websites use cookies and related technologies (**cookies**) to distinguish you from other visitors to our sites so we can understand how people interact with our websites. This helps us to provide you with a better website experience.

1. WHAT IS A COOKIE?

A cookie is a small piece of information sent by a website to the web browser on your computer, mobile or other device, which is then stored on your device's hard drive. Note that cookies cannot access your hard drive, so they can't read other information you have saved there.

Cookies do not identify you as an individual, only the device you are using. You can find out more about cookies at the [All About Cookies](#) website.

2. WHAT COOKIES DO WE USE AND WHY?

We only use two types of cookies on our websites.

Essential cookies, which are required to operate our websites efficiently so visitors can easily navigate around them. You can set your browser to block these cookies, noting that may result in you not being able to use the full functionality of the sites.

Functional cookies, which enable us to recognise and count the number of website visitors and see how visitors move around our websites. This helps us to improve the way our websites work, including by ensuring users can easily find what they are looking for.

We use functional cookies to:

- provide statistics on how the websites are being used
- provide feedback to affiliated entities that one of our visitors also visited their site
- obtain data on the number of website users that have viewed a product or service
- help us improve the website by measuring any errors that occur
- test different website designs.

You can find more information about the individual cookies we use and the purposes for which we use them in the table below.

3. WHOSE COOKIES ARE THEY?

First-party cookies are cookies that have been set by Morrison. They enable us to operate our website and services efficiently and to track patterns of behaviour of our website users.

Third-party cookies are cookies placed by service providers to help us understand how our websites are being used. We use Google Analytics, a web analytics service provided by Google, Inc., to collect information about visitor behaviour on our sites. Google uses that information to compile activity reports for us and evaluate the use of our websites.

Information collected by Google or any other third party is controlled exclusively by them and is subject to their own policies. You can find out more about Google Analytics and privacy [here](#).

4. HOW LONG WILL COOKIES STAY ON MY DEVICE?

The length of time a cookie will stay on your computer or mobile device depends on whether it is a "persistent" or "session" cookie.

Session cookies are temporary cookies that are automatically deleted when you leave a website or close your browser. Persistent cookies stay on your device until they expire or you delete them.

The duration of our persistent cookies is detailed in the table below.

5. HOW DO I CHANGE MY COOKIE SETTINGS?

We can use Essential cookies without obtaining your consent.

You are able to indicate your consent preferences by clicking “Accept all” or “Reject all non-essential” on the cookie banner that appears at the bottom of the page when you first access the site. Clicking on the “More Information” button in that banner will allow you to manage your specific cookie preferences by moving the on/off toggles where available.

Essential

These are used to operate the core functions of our website, so that you may visit and move around it, and use its features and to ensure we comply with financial laws. We do not require your consent to use these cookies.

Marketing

At present, we do not use these types of cookies so choosing to “Accept all” or moving this toggle to “on” will have no impact. If we wish to use these types of cookies in the future, we will provide details of the cookies so that you

can make an informed choice as to whether you consent to our use of them at that time.

Functional

These help us to understand how visitors use and move around our website, which inform improvements and adaptations to our website. Rejecting these cookies prevents us from collecting such data and the performance of our site will not be affected.

6. HOW TO MANAGE COOKIES USING YOUR BROWSER

Our systems do not currently recognise “do not track” browser requests. However, you can use your web browser settings to manually block all cookies, including essential cookies. Please note, however, that this may prevent you from accessing all or parts of our websites.
